Seven families met Richard Chambers of SOSSI at the entrance to the Shakespear Open Sanctuary Heritage Trail. Richard showed the children a variety of birds' nests and eggs, including a North Island Robin's nest with two eggs inside it. Along the trail Richard used some mealworms to entice robins to join us and the children used bird callers to attract robins and other native birds. Older children and their parents then walked up to the lookout for expansive views over the Hauraki Gulf.

## <u>Sea Birds at Shoal Bay</u>

Eleven children and their parents walked out onto the shell banks at the end of Charles Street. On the way across the mudflats numerous mud snails and little mud crabs were spotted. Perfect food for the birds. The mangrove leaves and roots were also examined to see their features.
