QLDC District Plan Change 51 - Peninsula Bay North – PBJV Ltd have appealed the entire decision of the QLDC to turn down their application to rezone the Open Space at the north end of Peninsula Bay in Wanaka. The Branch Committee is waiting to hear back from National Office whether we can join the appeal, to support the Council in defending their decision. The Council had decided that the zoning of the area as Open Space for informal recreation, visual amenity and biodiversity values better served the purpose of the RMA than allowing it to be developed for another 27 residential lots.

Shortcut Road Planting Project - Great news - the Branch has been successful and was granted \$19,264 from the DoC Community Conservation Fund to build a rabbit-proof fence around the planting areas at the Shortcut Road Native Restoration Planting Project (Rekos Point Conservation Area). This should be completed by early to mid April, and will include ferreting to rid the area of rabbits and weed control (broom, hemlock). **NEXT PLANTING DAY IS SATURDAY MAY 6 - mark your calendar now!**
