Enjoy a weekend of talks, walks and stimulating conversation at the Aongatete Outdoor Education Lodge, set in the beautiful Kaimai Mamaku Conservation Park. This is the site of the Aongatete Forest project, initiated by Forest and Bird, which has been working for over ten years to restore the forest and its wildlife.

Conservation is not just about forest and birds. This year we have a marine theme. Our speakers will talk about new developments and opportunities for marine protection, specifically at Motiti Island, the site of the tragic Rena disaster, and beyond in the Bay of Plenty. We'll also find out how the fisheries quota management system works (or does it?). There will be off-shore and estuary field trips as well as opportunities to enjoy the Aongatete forest and find out about its pest control.
