ITEM OF INTEREST:

RARE WETLANDS CAN BE DESTROYED

The Government has announced a consultation document which will allow new pathways for industries to destroy wetlands as exceptions to the protection in 2020 National Environment Standard for freshwater.

Forest and Bird Head Office propose to submit against this proposal. Already 90% of our wetlands have been lost and this proposal will allow more to be destroyed for mining including coal mining, quarrying, landfills and urban development.

Submitting against this proposal is expensive and your committee felt that we should contribute from the funds the branch has on hand. We have therefore voted to donate \$1,000 to this project. F & B have been successful in advocating to the Government against other recent schemes which would have destroyed the environment and we wish them well in this endeavour.
