




#### Results:

Continuation of 2020 Thesis findings:

Populations of 18 bird species were stable or had significant increases, tūī and riroriro, grey warbler in particular.

New survey records of long tailed cuckoo, koekoea. New locations for whitehead / popokotea & kaka







Possum numbers reduced:



150 humanely trapped

O possums trapped / detected at Shakespear since May 2021.

Rat numbers reduced:

11%->8%

April -> August detection on tracking cards.



Protecting our shorebirds: 60% increase in hedgehog catches.
