

# Mahoe-nui Bush Restoration Project

## How to get there

Mahoe-nui is a gully located behind Sumner Valley on the Port Hills. It was fenced off in 2006 and the volunteers from Forest and Bird and the Sumner Environment Group are helping the Port Hills rangers restore it to native bush. The **upper site** is above the summit road 900m west (towards the city from Evans Pass). This part has finished being planted and work now concentrates on the **lower site**. **Lower Mahoe-nui** is accessed from Evans Pass road just opposite Rapanui Bush and is at the top of the Captain Thomas walk.

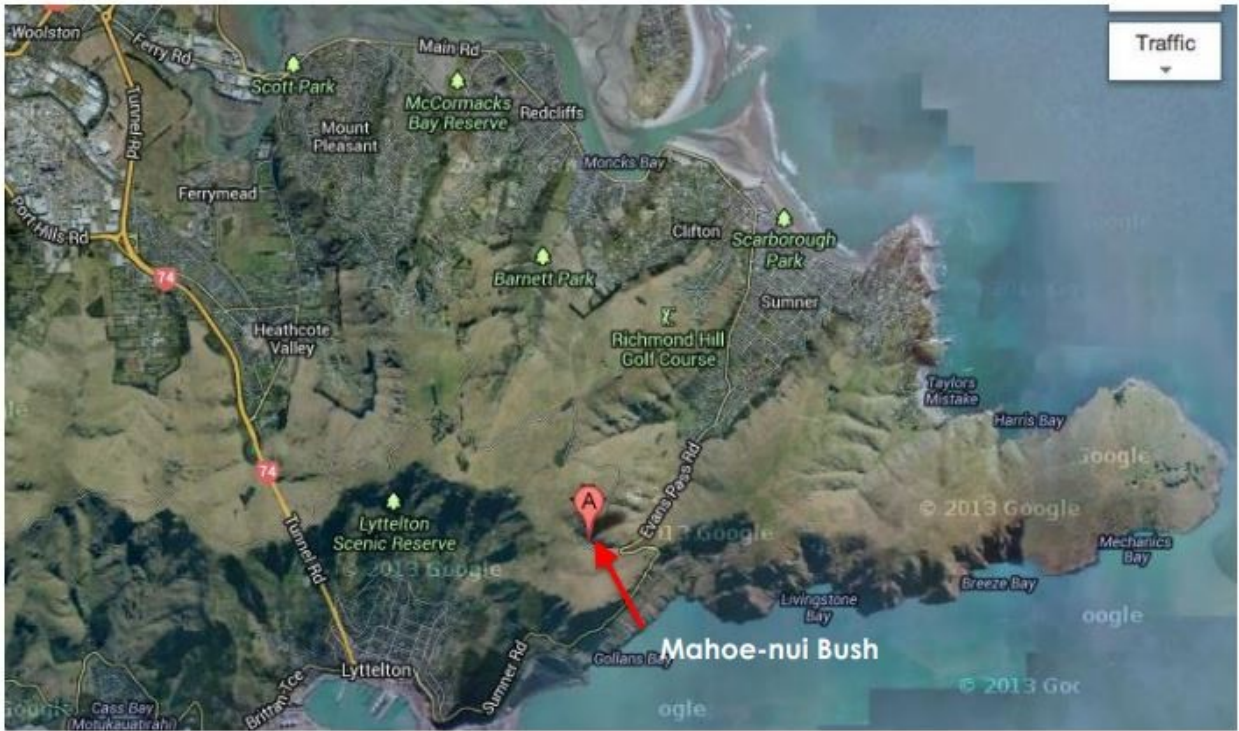


## Parking
