Talk: Phragmites *karka*: what is it and why it is a major problem

Speaker: Bessie Nicholls, Trustee, Awahuri Forest Kitchener Park, Feilding

Bessie will talk about this highly invasive and ecologically destructive plant. Phragmites *karka* was first identified in New Zealand in 2006 at Tangimoana, the Rangitikei River estuary. It was well established across the estuary when first recorded. It is unknown how long it has been in New Zealand or how it came into the country. Bessie has been leading the research trials as to how this plant can be controlled/destroyed, and she will let us know about the work that has been carried out. This plant is now spreading and has been found in areas outside the Manawatū
