## Lance McCaskill Memorial address

## Diana Shand introduced the speaker, Emeritus Professor Dave Kelly

"How will mast seeding respond under climate change? Recent discoveries show winners and losers." Professor Kelly described recent meticulous field research to find out how masting will be affected by rising mean temperatures as climate change accelerates. Using examples from NZ and Europe (Nothofagus, snow tussock, tawa) Dave showed that some plant species will have large reductions in seed output, but others will be unaffected.

Questions from the floor followed, and Helen Hills thanked Professor Kelly.

The evening was concluded with supper and a chat.
